News from Classrooms

Kindergarten Dual Language - In Kindergarten Dual Language, we have begun our new literacy unit on Native Americans. Students will be learning about different tribes and the similarities and differences these tribes shared.

ECE - In ECE, we are finishing up our animal habitat unit just in time to go to the Zoo on May 3rd. After we visit the Zoo, we will be starting our Spring unit where we will be learning about plants and bugs (always a kid favorite). We have also been working on re-telling the story of The Three Little Pigs and how important it is to always work hard and try your best!

ECE Dual Language - In our ECE Dual Language classes we are learning about Habitats and the animals that live in those habitats.

We are also learning about the Butterfly Life Cycle. Our students are showing their curiosity and interest by making observations and predictions with our classroom caterpillars.

REMINDER Families can Opt-In for 2022-23 Transportation beginning April 15 The Opt-In Program for the 2022-23 school year will go live April 15 and close June 30. Families of eligible students will need to log into <u>Parent Portal</u> and opt in their student if they require DPS transportation services. The Opt-In Program helps the Transportation Team properly allocate resources and make plans for students who intend to ride the bus. Gathering this data early will ensure more timely and efficient transportation at the start of the school year.

If families do not opt-in by June 30, we will plan our bus routes without their student. This doesn't change their student's eligibility, but it could cause a delay in service.
