Ms. Candee's First Grade and Second Grade SLD class went on a Gallery Walk outside this week! They observed, noticed, and wondered about the different habitats where animals live. They worked as partners and small groups to write their ideas under each real life picture.

They also made constellation viewers with recyclable materials. It was so exciting to see their astronomy learning come to life!

REMINDER Families can Opt-In for 2022-23 Transportation beginning April 15

The Opt-In Program for the 2022-23 school year will go live April 15 and close June 30. Families of eligible students will need to log into <u>Parent Portal</u> and opt in their student if they require DPS transportation services. The Opt-In Program helps the Transportation Team properly allocate resources and make plans for students who intend to ride the bus. Gathering this data early will ensure more timely and efficient transportation at the start of the school year.

If families do not opt-in by June 30, we will plan our bus routes without their student. This doesn't change their student's eligibility, but it could cause a delay in service.
