

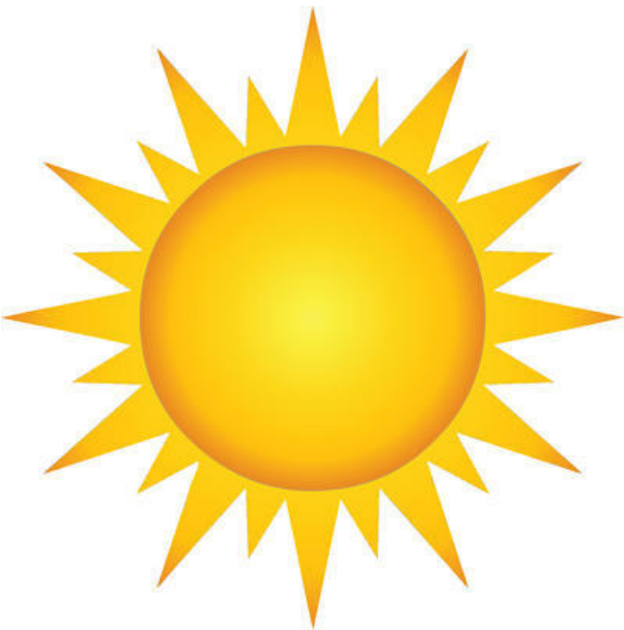

Welcome Discovery Link Families!



Discovery Link Summer Camp will be held
June 1st- July 30th

Discovery Link programs have been operating successfully since July 2020. Program operations are based on the recommendations by local health experts regarding the potential impact of COVID-19.

Discovery Link programs are operating at a reduced capacity to support physical distancing guidelines provided by local health experts and state licensing agencies for the safety of our students, families and staff.

REGISTRATION

Registration for summer programs opened via SchoolCare Works on **Monday, February 8th**. Registration is first come, first serve.

Hours of Operation

All Discovery Link programs will be **open from 6:30AM to 6PM** for fee based sites and **8AM to 4PM** for grant funded sites.



Fee-based Discovery Link Programs

Discovery Link programs will have a **daily fee of \$40.00**. If your family traditionally applies for CCAP (Colorado Childcare Assistance Program), please email discovery_link@dpsk12.org.

Grant Site Discovery Link Programs

Discovery Link programs at Cowell, Ellis, DCIS Fairmont and Kaiser are free to students in those communities.



Limited Capacity

All Discovery Link programs will be at a limited capacity to provide safe physical distancing for students and staff.



No Late Registrations

Registration will close 24 hours before day of care. After registration closes, Discovery Link will no longer be able to accept student registration after that. We are not able to offer Drop ins.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Discovery Link Summer Camp programs will operate at a reduced capacity to support physical distancing guidelines. Denver Public Schools and Extended Learning will continue to follow the requirements from our local health experts and state licensing agencies safety of our students, families and staff.



FACE-COVERINGS (2/DAY REQUIRED)

- Children attending the Discovery Link program will be required to wear a face-covering or a mask at all times, with the exception of eating or drinking.
- Children will be expected to bring at least **2** clean face-coverings or masks to the program each day.
- Exceptions will only be made with wearing face-coverings or masks when a note from a doctor is submitted to the Discovery Link program supervisor.



PHYSICAL DISTANCING

- Discovery Link encourages 6-foot distancing.
- Students will be encouraged and reminded about the health and safety of 6-foot physical distancing guidelines to best promote a new learning experience in a safe environment.



HAND WASHING

Students will be required to hand-wash upon arrival to their program and at consistent intervals throughout the day.

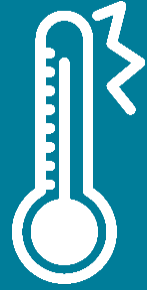

Daily Temperature Checks

Our programs are required to conduct daily health surveys and temperature checks for students. If a child and/or parent answers the health survey that indicates there is an illness in the home, or if a student's temperature is at/or above 100.4°F or 38°C, it will be imperative that parents keep their children home, for the safety of their child and the safety of others.
